Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Shri Satya Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Dhanupura (Lodhipur Rajput) Delhi Road, Po Pakbara, Moradabad-244102, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0498) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Shri Satya Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Dhanupura (Lodhipur Rajput) Delhi Road, Po Pakbara, Moradabad-244102, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0498)** inspection was conducted on **20.03.2025 and 21.03.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

1. Teaching staff:-

Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{44}{45} \times 100\% = 97.78\%$ (Excluding Excess)

- 3) The, Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM is in receipt of a letter vide ref no. SSAMCH/25/31 dated 20.05.2025 from you requesting to allow to pay the balanced amount of Rs. 3.25 crore out of imposed monetary penalty of Rs. 4.25 crore in academic year 2023-24 in 06 installments. Further, assessment report along with the request was duly placed in the 126th

Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 13.06.2025 and Board approved the request of the college to pay the balanced amount of Rs. 3.25 crore out of imposed monetary penalty of Rs. 4.25 crore in 06 installments and same was communicated to you vide letter of even no. dated 17.06.2025 and Board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulation but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Further the Board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for issuance of extended permission in accordance with regulation 54(2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations 2024, as monetary penalty of Rs. 4.25 crore was imposed on the college as per section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic year 2023-24. Hence, the Board decided to issue yearly permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations, 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.

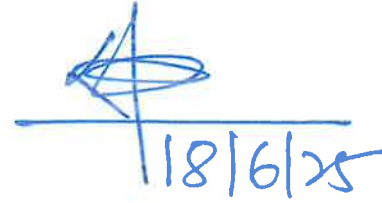
- 4) Therefore, Yearly Permission is hereby granted to Shri Satya Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Dhanupura (Lodhipur Rajput) Delhi Road, Po Pakbara, Moradabad-244102, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0498) with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.
- 5) The aforementioned permission is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings along with following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
 - I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 6) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 7) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 8) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 9) **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.

iv) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, shall be fulfilled.

- 10)** The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
